RULES & REGULATIONS

- This is a mini cricket format. Wicket to Wicket being 22 yards, and boundary radius being 25 meters. Throwing line for female bowler at 15 meters.
- Cricket match will be played between two teams made up of eight players in each team.
- The playing Eight should consist of 6 Male Players + 2 Female Players .
- Among eight players two life members are compulsory.
- Only Orthodontists and students pursuing post-graduation in Orthodontics can play.
- All matches will be played using tennis ball.
- Matches will be played IN DOUBLE INNINGS FORMAT with 5 balls per over.
- IINNINGS- 5 overs.
- II INNINGS- 3 overs
- Each team should bowl 5 overs in the first innings.
- 1 over female Throw/Bowling.
- 4 overs male Bowling only.
- Each team should bowl 3 overs in the second innings.
- 1 over female Throw/bowling.
- 2 overs male Bowling only.
- Batting should be opened by a Male player and a Female player only in the first innings & any team member can bat in the second innings.
- Hit Wicket is considered Not Out for a female player.
- Batsman who hits the cricket ball outside the boundary (Full toss) is considered OUT.
- If the ball hits the cones, placed around the boundary full toss, it is considered OUT.
- When a Female Player is batting, the bowler is allowed to throw the cricket ball (over arm only).
- Each player can bowl only one over per innings (Unless super over).
- Bowlers are not allowed to bowl fast to the female batsman, and if the female batsman appeals for a fast delivery, or if otherwise, the umpires can signal a dead ball, for a fast delivery bowled to a female batsman.
- The ball can pitch a maximum of two times on the pitch, for a female who is bowling, and only once for a male, failing which it is declared a Dead Ball.
- Chucking is strictly not allowed by male bowlers for male batsman.
- Batsman has the right to appeal against chucking.
- No-ball will attract one run (over stepping, bouncer) however there is No FREE HIT
- Bowler shall not be allowed to bowl over the head bouncer. Bouncer : A ball which passes or would have passed above the shoulder height of the striker standing upright at the popping crease or full toss bowled above the waist height will be considered as a No-Ball.
- Any number of bouncers in an over is considered as a No-Ball.
- Stepping on a side crease, during bowling is a No-Ball.
- If the batsman hits the cricket ball outside the boundary (full toss) during a no ball being bowled is considered as Five Runs(four runs + one run for a no-ball) and the batsman is considered not out, However if the ball pitches and then leaves the boundary, it is considered as Five Runs(four runs + one run for a no-ball)

- No substitute runners are allowed.
- Mankading is allowed. "The bowler is permitted, before entering his delivery stride, to attempt to run out the nonstriker. Whether the attempt is successful or not, the ball shall not as one of the over. If the bowler fails in an attempt to run out the non-striker, the umpire shall call and signal Dead ball as soon as possible".
- No runs will be awarded for wide deliveries but will have to re-bowl that delivery.
- No leg before wicket and leg byes.
- If the ball hits the batsman, i.e if a leg bye, there won't be any run-outs given.
- Runs are awarded for byes and overthrows, including the bye runs that come out through a wide delivery.
- Substitution in fielding is allowed for only 2 players per team at any point of time during play. Only Female player can replace a Female player.
- No Retired Hurt. Unless batsman is injured seriously, and only if the opposition team captain agrees for the same, can take a retired hurt, applicable only for male players.

CAPTAINS RESPONSIBILITY

- Request captains of every team to ensure that one of their representatives will be there with scorer to avoid confusion. If any clarification, please clarify there itself.
- Captains please ensure that your players are ready on time.
- Each team may have to play 5-6 matches per day to finish schedule on time.
- Only captains are requested to talk to umpires for any clarifications.
- After every match, captains are requested to sign on the score sheet and will be informed about the net run rate.
- Captains to ensure their teams playing the next match in each ground are to be present when the previous match is going on, as a toss for the match will be done during the innings break of the previous match.
- If a team fails to report within 15 minutes, of the scheduled / tentative time of the match, the opponent team will get a walk over with 2 points.
- In case of Tie : league and Knock out stages
- 1 over, super over match to be played.
- Only 3 batsmen per team to bat in those two overs.
- If the match is a tie after the tie breaker, match is decided by a Toss.
- If more than one team has same number of points in the league stages, then the team with better run rate qualifies
- If teams have the same run rate also, then the Run Quotient will be calculated.
- Only 5 minutes break/innings given, so as to finish the tournament on schedule.
- Points are as below :
- Win-2 points.
- Loss 0 points.
- In case of rain interruption, match will be continued from where it had stopped (No Rematch)
- Any information regarding the rules, please contact organizers before the match only.
- To apply the law and make sure the cricket rules are upheld throughout the game there are two On field umpires in place during games.
- Umpires are responsible for making decisions and notifying the scorers of these decisions.
- In case of bad light, batsman has the right to stop the play in conjunction with the umpire, however umpires call is final.

PUBLIC NOTICE

It has come to the notice of the Dental Council of India that some of the private companies, by engaging dentists, offering in-home services to the patients bypassing the professional expertise of the Dentists and functioning on aggressive marketing violating the provisions of Clinical Establishments (Registration and Regulation) Act, 2010, Dentists Act, 1948 and Revised Dentists (Code of Ethics) Regulations, 2014. Therefore, such companies, all dentists and the public at large, for their dental treatment, be advised as under:-

- 1. The dental treatment shall be given to the patient by the registered dentists in his / her clinic / hospital.
- 2. The scanning of teeth of patients shall be performed by registered dentists only. Scanning of teeth performed by any non-dentist will be a gross violation of Dentists Act, 1948.
- 3. Registration of dentist must be mentioned / displayed or provided at all Web Portals of the company / clinic.
- 4. Dentists should provide highest quality of treatment for better outcome, providing/endorsing treatment with proper examination, tests, thorough diagnosis and treatment planning, with proper follow up for patient care.
- 5. Biomedical standard waste management / sterilization protocol shall be followed by all dentists.
- 6. Companies shall not project their **aggressive advertisement campaigns**, to lure common man for getting dental treatment.

All State Dental Councils / Tribunals are hereby directed to take necessary action against such companies / dentists those are violating the provisions of Clinical Establishments (Registration and Regulation) Act, 2010, Dentists Act, 1948 and Revised Dentists (Code of Ethics) Regulations, 2014, as per law.
