Also were present the Post Graduate students from various colleges of country in large numbers.



facial growth, enhance smile esthetics and jaw function.

For the layman, food particles stuck around the braces, teeth and gums is simply unsightly. However, not cleaning teeth and gums while undergoing orthodontic treatment has serious repercussions. The obvious one is developing cavities around the braces, when food trapped around the braces are not cleared off.

Not cleaning the plaque and food items which might be trapped between the wires and the gums can end up creating **white spot lesions**, or worse still, hypo calcified areas on tooth which crumbles later, attracting and trapping more of the plaque and food particles, eventually developing into cavities. A more sinister effect of not maintaining oral hygiene lies beneath. Plaque and food particles around the gums irritate the gums, which in turn irritates the bone support of the teeth under the gums. Continuous irritation of the bony tissue induces reactions within, that makes the bone support disappear, weakening the bone support of the tooth. In a nutshell, not maintaining excellent oral hygiene, can damage not just the integrity of the visible part of the tooth, it can considerably weaken it too.



from UP state dental council. Overall it was a very






enriching experience for everyone and students look for to more such programe.
