One notion which has sunk deep in many a minds is, that if one needs orthodontic treatment, it is mandatory that few teeth will have to be removed, so that the others can be aligned correctly. Fortunately, that is not correct! The more we, orthodontists, learn; the more we improve upon our skills; the more updated technology we incorporate in our practice and the more research in the field of orthodontics advances, the better are the chances to give patients a healthy, beautiful smile, with an optimally functional set of teeth and jaws, without the need of extracting teeth. Having said that, there will always be a few cases, which will certainly improve upon, one or all of the following - function, esthetics or, stability, if a few dental units (teeth) are removed.

One way or increasing your chances of not having any teeth to be removed, as a part of orthodontic treatment would be, to ensure, that your dental health is kept in check right from the days of milk teeth. Ensure the child visits a dentist for dental health follow up, from the age of one year, irrespective of the child's dental health. Remember to consult an orthodontist, when the child is seven years old, even if you feel nothing appears wrong with the teeth. It is in your best interests, that for all orthodontic needs, you seek the advice and treatment from an IOS endorsed Orthodontist.




Dr. Jayakumar Ganesan-1976 - 2019
